## Legislation

- International power lines are federally regulated
  - National Energy Board Act
  - Canadian Environmental Assessment Act, 2012
- NEB Act allows for provincial review
  - Transmission lines only
  - Provincial process meets federal standards
  - Through Order in Council
  - OIC submitted with application to the NEB
  - NEB Certificate or permit



### Legislation

- Manitoba Environment Act
- Classes of Development Regulation
  - Electric transmission lines and transformer stations
    >230 kV
  - Class 3 Development
  - Section 12 of the Environment Act
  - Ministerial Decision
- Clean Environment Commission



### Legislation

- Manitoba Environment Act
  - Process must meet federal requirements
- Clean Environment Commission
  - Common for Class 3
  - Not provincially a legislative requirement
  - Provides enhanced opportunity for public
  - Process informs sound decision making
  - Hearings are required for this project in lieu of federal NEB hearings



- Proposal filed November 21, 2014
- Draft Scoping Document
  - Advertised newspapers
  - Posted on public registry
  - Comments invited to February 9, 2015
  - Technical Advisory Committee
  - National Energy Board
  - Public



- Scoping Document
  - Finalized in June 2015
  - Final version posted on public registry
  - Liaison with NEB regulators
  - National Energy Board
  - Public (5 comments)
  - Land values and process questions



- Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) filed September 22, 2015
- Placed/posted in the public registry
- Advertised
- Comments invited to November 30, 2015
  - TAC
  - Public
  - Federal government



- Comments and Questions
  - Iterative information requests (IR)
  - October 2015 to April 2016
- Manitoba Hydro filed the final response to IRs on April 29, 2016
- Environmental Approvals Summary
  - Final October 2016
  - Posted in registry



# Next Steps

- October 2016 Env. Approvals report posted
- EAB advises CEC:
  - Staff process is complete
  - Issues raised during the review were either
    - addressed in Manitoba Hydro's responses to the information requests; or
    - can be addressed in licensing conditions.
