### Message from Chief Betsy Kennedy



Since the last edition of the Moosecoot Times our community has changed a great deal. The Moosecoot Gas Bar and Convenience store is open and providing a great service to our community. The first phase of the water and sewer project has started. The new garage building is nearing completion, the road to War Lake is nearing completion, there are four new houses in the community as well as new accommodation for community visitors at the Lodge that is managed by the Moosecoot Gas Bar. These projects are not only improving our community but providing employment for War Lake Members. As well, Chief and Council are continuing to negotiate with government agencies in order to obtain an all-weather road from Ifford to York Landing.

It has been 14 months since the signing of the JKDA and in spite of delays, the War Lake First Nation and War Lake Members will begin to realize business and employment opportunities arising from the Direct Negotiated Contracts. The work associated with these contracts will provide training and employment opportunities for War Lake Members during the Keeyask Construction period. Some of this work has already begun with the construction of the South Access road and with the work that will commence this fall on improvements to PR280. As well, War Lake, along with Tataskweyak Cree Nation recently signed the On-Going Jobs agreement with Manitoba Hydro which will provide, over the next 20 years, opportunities for Members to obtain the training that

they require to obtain jobs in on-going Manitoba Hydro operations.

War Lake First Nation and Tataskweyak Cree Nation are in the process of reviewing and editing a number of documents in order to support the environmental and regulatory approvals that will be required by the Keeyask Project. These documents include the Environmental Impact Statement, the Environmental Assessment Report and the Socio-Economic Impact Report. We are happy to report that this is proceeding well and that our relationship with Manitoba Hydro, Manitoba and Canada in relation to the Keeyask Project continues to offer benefits for our community.

On behalf of the community I would like to thank Trina Ouskun for the great job that she did as Principal of the Julie Lyndal School and for her active involvement in the community. We all appreciate the fact that her first priority was always to do what was best for her students. Thank you Trina and good luck in the future.

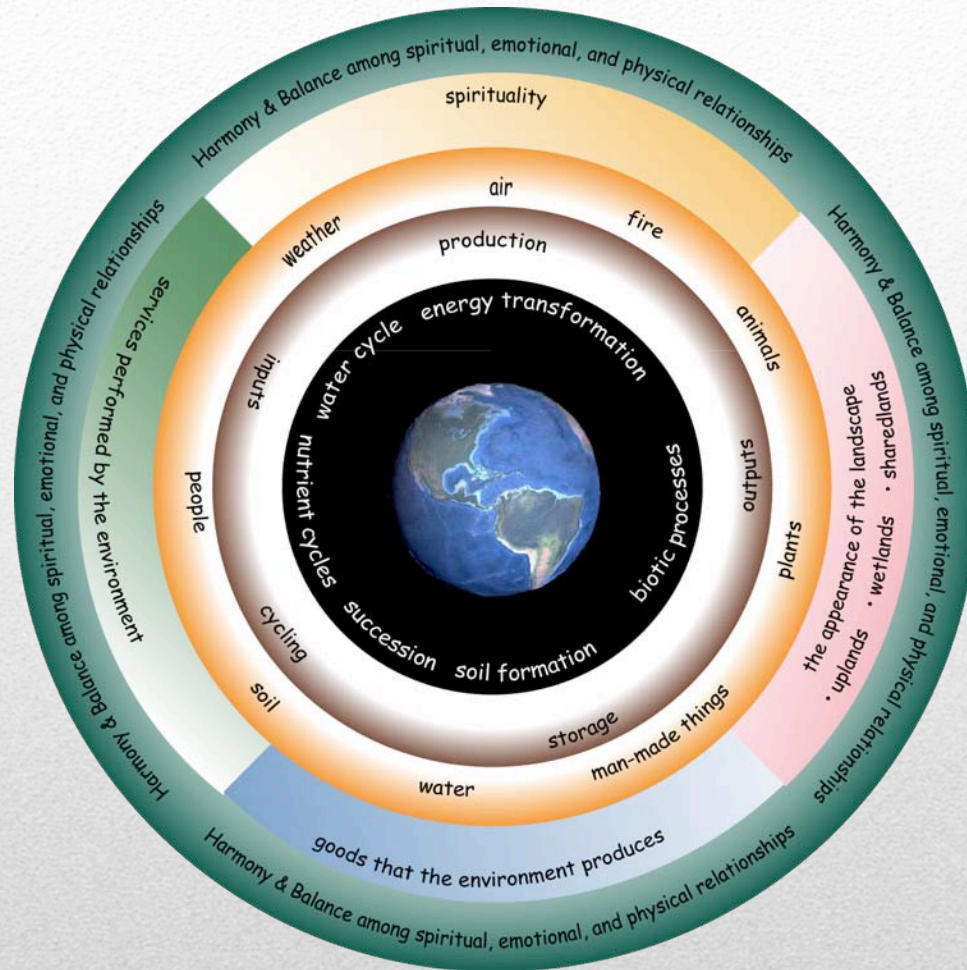
