My name is Thierry Marchildon-Lavoie and I am strongly opposed to the Silica Sand Extraction Project in Vivian, Manitoba.

Mining has no place in a drinking aquifer.

Why are we putting mining extraction ahead of the health of Manitoba citizens and it's drinking water? I oppose the Sio Silica mining operation in Vivian, MB and ask the CEC to deny the license.

The main purpose of frac sand mining is to facilitate further expansion of the fossil fuel industry in Canada. Hundreds of scientists around the world are urging that the fossil fuel industry must be scaled down (and not further propped up) if our planet is to avoid a warming of 1.5 degrees over pre-industrial levels. Manitobans, like people everywhere, are anxious about our futures and are demanding that real climate action be taken to protect our collective future.

To maintain a livable planet, we urgently and rapidly need to transition away from fossil fuel use. Solar panels and batteries may be part of that transition, but if we destroy our water and land to produce them, what have we gained? I am strongly opposed to this project.

Who will pay when a mining accident occurs and drinking water is contaminated? Manitoba citizens?

We need to protect our environment. Clean drinking water needs to be protected. I oppose the Sio Silica mining operation in Vivian, MB and ask the CEC to deny the license.
