

Answers to Undertakings Provided by Manitoba Hydro

Undertaking # 1 (May 8, 2017 – Page 116)

Would Manitoba Hydro have included The Path to Reconciliation Act in Table 2-1 under “Guidance Only”?

Table 2-1 deals specifically with environmental legislation that requires authorizations and/or notifications. Manitoba Hydro would not have characterized this legislation in that manner and, as such, would not likely have included it in that Table, had it been in force at the time the EIS was filed.

Undertaking # 2 (May 8, 2017 – Page 116)

Why did Manitoba Hydro not include *The Natural Resources Transfer Act* in Table 2-1?

For the reasons set out in the answer to Undertaking # 1, Manitoba Hydro did not consider *The Natural Resources Transfer Act* to be an environmental statute per se and, as such, it was not included in the Table.

Answers to Informal Undertakings Provided by Manitoba Hydro

Will Manitoba Hydro make the weather study available? (May 8, 2017, Page 194)

Manitoba Hydro will provide copies to the CEC and will email it to all Participants.

Is it fair to say that the documents produced by the TAC committee and provided to Manitoba Hydro have been made available to this process? (May 8, 2017, Page 219)

Where the TAC provided Manitoba Hydro with documentation as part of an Information Request, that documentation is on the public registry.

Produce a more current copy of the climate change report that was released in 2015? (May 8, 2017, Page 225)
